From 1935 to 1946, during the Great Depression and World War II, Trinity Pro-Cathedral was merged with St. Paul's Church, which then became Christ Church Cathedral. Trinity became the "Bishop's Chapel".

Episcopal Chronology

- 1853 The Rev. **William Ingraham Kip** (Rector, Trinity Church, San Francisco) is elected Bishop of the Missionary District of California.
- 1874 The Missionary Jurisdiction of Northern California is created in the 26 counties of northern California (Sonoma, Napa, Solano, Sacramento, Amador, and north to the Oregon border) and the Rev. **John Henry Ducachet Wingfield** (Rector, St. Paul's, Petersburg, Virginia) is elected its first Bishop. Kip continues as Bishop of the newly created Diocese of California.
- 1896 Bishop Wingfield is incapacitated by stroke.
- 1897 The Rt. Rev. **Anson Roger Graves**, Missionary Bishop of The Platte (Nebraska and Wyoming), assumes interim duties as Bishop-in-Charge during Wingfield's incapacity.
- 1897 First service held at St. Andrew's Mission (23rd and "K" Sts.) on the First Sunday of Lent, March 6, 1897.
- 1898 The Missionary Jurisdiction of Northern California becomes the Missionary District of Sacramento (including five counties in western Nevada). The Rev. **William Hall Moreland** (Rector, St. Luke's, San Francisco) is elected Bishop and then consecrated January 25, 1899, the first bishop of the Episcopal Church to be consecrated west of the Rockies.
- 1901 Trinity Mission constructed on 26th St., between Capitol Ave. and "N" St. The church building was later (1905?) moved to front on Capitol Ave. and enlarged by the addition of a narthex.
- 1910 The Missionary District becomes the Diocese of Sacramento.
- 1933 The Ven. **William Archie Noel Porter** (Archdeacon of California) is elected Bishop Coadjutor. On November 9 Bishop Moreland resigns and leaves California; Bishop Porter becomes Diocesan.
- 1957 The Very Rev. **Clarence Rupert Haden, Jr.** (Dean of Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral, Kansas City, Mo.) is elected Bishop Coadjutor, succeeding Bishop Porter in 1958.
- 1961 Diocese of Sacramento is renamed the Diocese of Northern California.
- 1967 The Rev. **Edward McNair** (Rector, Church of the Incarnation, Santa Rosa) is elected Suffragan Bishop. (Retired due to illness in 1973.)
- 1978 The Rev. **John Lester Thompson, III** (Rector, Christ Church, Eureka.) is elected Bishop Coadjutor, succeeding Bishop Haden in that year.
- 1991 The Rev. **Jerry Alban Lamb** (Assistant to the Bishop of Oregon) is elected Bishop Coadjutor, succeeding Bishop Thompson in 1992. Retired January 31, 2006.
- 2006 The Rev. **Barry Leigh Beisner** was elected Bishop Coadjutor on May 21, 2006, and was installed on February 2, 2007.
